TRANSPORTATION

Venue

The event will take place outside the facilities at both the Humanities and Social Sciences Institute (Instituto de Ciencias Sociales y Humanidades) and the Philosophy and Literature School (Facultad de Filosofía y Letras). Additionally, some other activities will also be coordinated at the Carolino Building, central office of the Benemérita Universidad Autónoma de Puebla (BUAP). All of the mentioned buildings are located at the Historic Center (downtown) in the City of Puebla; one block from the main square that is called “Zócalo”.

How to get there?

Airports

There is a local airport near Puebla (16 miles aprox.); however, flights are not very frequent and most of them have a layover at Mexico City. The local airport’s name is “Aeropuerto Hermanos Serdán” in Huejotzingo (PBC).

For visitors from abroad, once they are in Mexico City it is more convenient to request a ticket at the MC International Airport, “Benito Juárez”, and then complete the trip to Puebla by ground transportation directly from this place.

For those who come from other places in the country (Monterrey, Guadalajara, Chetumal, etc.) it would be convenient to arrive directly to PBC since it is usually easy to find inexpensive flights traveling with Interjet or Volaris.

Transfer from the Hermanos Serdán Airport in Huejotzingo, Puebla

Right at the Hermanos Serdán Airport (PBC) you can find buses that can take passengers to the “Poniente 4” bus station (see below the section “Transfer to the Hotel”).

It is also possible to get a taxi that can take you directly to your hotel. Nonetheless, this form of transportation might turn out to be quite expensive (\$200- \$300 MXN/ \$20-\$30 USD) but it is always a practical choice.

Transfer from the Mexico City International Airport

The Benito Juárez Airport has two main stations where you can take direct buses to Puebla. At Station 2, the bus stop to buy your ticket is located right at the end; immediately after going out from Customs you turn right towards the exit approximately 100



meters (328 feet). At Station 1 once you pass the Customs door it would be more convenient to ask an officer or a bellboy for the adequate directions to reach the bus stop and buy your ticket to Puebla.

The single bus trip to Puebla is around \$250 MXN (\$25 USD). You can always pay in cash or by credit/debit card. In addition, it is possible to find accessible ATMs to withdraw some money or, in case you need it, a currency exchange stand.

These buses to Puebla leave every thirty minutes and stop at both Airport Stations. They alternate their destinations to reach two terminals in Puebla (CAPU and 4 Poniente). They both are near downtown. Buses that go to the CAPU leave at the o'clock hour and those which go to the 4 Poniente leave at the half hour. During vacation time, it is possible to find more frequent bus departures for both terminals.

The CAPU (Central de Autobuses de Puebla) is the Central Bus Terminal in Puebla and it is also a little farther from downtown (20 minutes). Because of its size, it is also a more complicated place since there are always a lot of people. On the contrary, the 4 Poniente is smaller and closer to downtown. Many locals and visitors tend to prefer the arrival to this later for we think it is more comfortable, but the truth is both terminals are quite safe.

Transfer to the Hotel

Right at both terminals it is possible to find ticket booths to buy “Taxi-Autorizado” trips. The ticket is around \$60 MXN (\$6 USD) and covers up four passengers and their luggage.

All the suggested hotels are located downtown at a few blocks (2-5) from the symposium venues.
